

Main reasons why people fail IELTS writing on their <u>first attempt:</u>



- Today, everyone uses an auto-checker and therefore does not pay attention to the errors they make.
- Usually the practice of IELTS writing is very boring and so many prefer to watch video tips and hope that their writing skill will improve by itself.
- You need to have an advanced English creative thinking to write an IELTS essay, unfortunately most do not have a developed creative thinking even in their native language.
- Many believe they will be able to get the appropriate score for their IELTS writing if they practice a few essay topics.




Main reasons why people fail IELTS writing on their <u>first attempt:</u>



Many people get nervous during the IELTS exam and so forget everything they have learnt before the test, this usually happens when a person is not mentally ready for this type of situation.

Result: low score for the IELTS writing section and the necessity to take the test again.

How to Prepare IELTS Writing effectively:



Don't try to jump over your head, and start writing an IELTS essay with a timer right away.



Start to practice IELTS writing systematically.





Try out to type only one part of the IELTS essay.



Try out to retype a few samples of IELTS writing.



Try out to type IELTS writing without a timer.

What exactly **DO NOT DO**

STOP

Rely on the advice of those who have passed IELTS without proper training.

Wasting time on watching usually practically useless video tips and recommendations.

Try to somehow cheat the system and use cunning tricks.

Rarely practice IELTS writing only 1-2 times a week.

Typing essay conclusions (15 - 30 minutes)

Full IELTS writing with timer (90 minutes)

Sat Rest day



Structure of IELTS essay

There are many different IELTS essay structures. But we recommend you to stick to the following essay structure.

Introduction: (2 sentences)

- First sentence paraphrasing the topic question.
- Second sentence your opinion.

1st body paragraph: (4 sentences)

- 1st sentence your statement of the first topic issue.
- 2nd sentence proof of this statement.
- 3rd sentence example of this statement.
- 4th sentence conclusion of the paragraph.

2nd body paragraph: (4 sentences)

- 1st sentence your statement of the second topic issue.
- 2nd sentence proof of this statement.
- 3rd sentence example of this statement.
- 4th sentence conclusion of the paragraph.

Conclusion: (1 sentences)

• 1st sentence - paraphrasing of the second sentence from the introduction.



Structure of Academic IELTS task 1

Introduction: (1 sentences)

1st sentence - simply paraphrase the question.

2st paragraph: (2 sentences)

- 1st sentence report the first main feature of a graph or chart.
- 2nd sentence report the second main feature of a graph or chart.

3nd paragraph: (2 sentences)

- 1st sentence give evidence to support the first key features.
- 2nd sentence give evidence to support the second key feature.

4rd paragraph: (2 sentences)

- 1st sentence report the third main feature of a graph or chart.
- 2nd sentence give evidence to support the third main feature.



Structure of General IELTS task 1

Greeting: (1 sentences)

 1st sentence - Dear Sir or Madam, Dear Mr. or Mrs Name, Dear friend's name.

Introduction: (1 sentences)

• 1st sentence - answer the first topic's question

1st paragraph: (2 sentences)

- 1st sentence answer the second topic's question.
- 2nd sentence give evidence to support your answer.

2nd paragraph: (2 sentences)

- 1st sentence answer the third topic's question.
- 2nd sentence give evidence to support your answer.

letter ending: (1 sentence)

- 1st sentence use standard letter ending pattern.
- 2nd sentence your name and surename.



How to write an IELTS essay intorduction & conclusion.

IELTS essay introduction is usually 2 to 3 sentences long.

The first sentence is a paraphrased topic

The second sentence is your opinion

The third sentence is usually written only in a solution essay.

The conclusion of an IELTS essay usually consists of one sentence.

In the conclusion, it is enough to express what has already been said in the introduction in other words, only to do it in such a form that the conclusion looks like an organic consequence of the main part of the essay.

When the introduction and conclusion are collected like a puzzle -from the topic and your opinion -you can proceed to writing the main part.



How to write an IELTS essay intorduction.

Example of a two sentence introduction:

TOPIC: Some people think that in order to learn an additional language well it is necessary to live in the country where that language is spoken. What is your opinion about this?

The meaning of the sentence is identical to the meaning of the first sentence of the topic.

It is thought by some people that to learn another language and to be a fluent user of it makes sense, if they live in a countrywhere this language is predominantly spoken.

Note that the second sentence is the answer to the question in the assignment.

In my opinion, learning language to its perfection depends on the goals pursued by people and today it is possible to live insome countries and be fluent in only one of the global languages.



How to write an IELTS essay intorduction.

Example of a three-sentence introduction:

TOPIC: Many people today use their phones for sending texts more than talking. What are the reasons for this? Are there more advantages than disadvantages?

The first sentence is a paraphrase of the first sentence of the topic.

An increasing number of people today are apt to use their cell phones for texting rather than conversing with each.

The second sentence answers the question in the assignment.

In my opinion, this option is more popular among people, especially young ones, because of its convenience and flexibility incomparison with maintaining conversation.

And the last sentence is a more detailed answer to the question in the assignment.

This feature certainly helps people express their emotions through pictures and symbols but there are also a number of drawbacksthis attitude has.



How to write an IELTS essay conclusion.

Example of writing a conclusion

TOPIC: Some people think that to learn a second language well it is necessary to live in the country where that language is spoken. What is your opinion about this?

The second sentence from intorduction

In my opinion, learning language to its perfection depends on the goals pursued by people and today it is possible to live insome countries and be fluent in only one of the global languages.

The conclusion is a paraphrase of the second sentence from introduction.

In conclusion, while language usage is commonly considered to be more practical by living in its spoken country, many other benefits such as work opportunities and studying should be taken into account.



How to structure paragraphs depending on the type of essay.

Expressing opinions essay

First paragraph – first opinion; Second paragraph – second opinion;

Advantages/Disadvantages essay

First paragraph – a description of advantages or disadvantages;

Second paragraph – a description of the advantages if in the first paragraph you described the disadvantages and vice versa;

Providing Solutions essay

First paragraph – a description of the problem;

Second paragraph – a description of the solution to the given problem;

Discursive Essay

First paragraph – a description of the advantages or disadvantages, positive or negative features of the given situation; Second paragraph – an overview of the opposite side of the given point of view, depending on what you described in the first paragraph.



Example of writing essay paragraph

TOPIC: Many people today use their phones for sending texts more than talking. What are the reasons for this? Are there more advantages than disadvantages?

First sentence of the first paragraph is the answer to the first question in the assignment.

There is little room for doubt that this contemporary option of modern devices is beneficial for people, as it allows people to send various types of messages without hesitation and waiting for direct response on it.

The same idea is described in the second sentence, only with additional evidence supporting the opinion.

In other words, by having the ability to express their thoughts or send important notifications, people can share information with their colleagues and friends at any convenient time.



Example of writing essay paragraph

Third sentnece is an example of why people use telephones for messages more often than for making calls.

A typical example for this would be that people are able to send valuable notifications, such as meeting arrangements, their arrival date and time, or their current locations, through messengers.

The forth sentence is a conclusion built around the idea mentioned in the paragraph.

Thus, an increasing popularity of texting is closely associated with its flexibility and less time consumption.





How to write 1st IELTS tasks

1st IELTS assignments are very diverse and therefore it is impossible to schematically structure the writing of paragraphs and give examples.

We recommend you retype several samples on our website to familiarize yourself with the various structures.
